Dr. Anastasia Giannakidou is currently a professor of Linguistics here at UChicago. She received her B.A. in Greek Philology and M.A. in Linguistics from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece, with a Ph.D. in Linguistics from the University of Groningen in the Netherlands. Her broad interests lie in the area of meaning (semantics), and its relation to linguistic form (morphology and syntax), with further interest in how sentences are used in context (pragmatics) to produce and enrich meaning. She is interested in describing the grammar of Greek, her mother tongue, from a crosslinguistic perspective. Besides Greek, she has also worked on Romance (Spanish and Catalan mainly), Germanic languages (German and Dutch), and recently, in joint work, Chinese and Basque. She also has a keen interest in bilingualism and has published numerous journal articles and several books.
