



## **MAPH Programming/Education Fellowship – Summer 2017**

The MAPH Programming/Education Fellowship opportunity at the Chicago Humanities Festival (CHF) provides each student with the following: working experience in the country's leading public humanities organization, access to world-renowned humanities scholars, interaction with Chicago's top cultural institutions, and a mentored team environment in which to build varied skills for future employment.

### **Principal Responsibilities:**

- Work in conjunction with the CHF programming team to manage day-to-day logistics of the Humanities Without Walls Graduate Workshop Series and Humanities Without Walls Summit (scheduled from July 17 – August 4, 2017)
- Assist the programming team in the conceptualization and execution of the Fall 2017 festival, including but not limited to assisting with presenter logistics related to travel, accommodations and program content.
- Assist with the coordination of educational seminars related to Fall programs.
- Assist with CHF community engagement and educational marketing projects
- Collaborate with the CHF programming team on the development of public programs for the Winter/Spring 2018 season; brainstorm ideas for the Fall 2018 Festival

- Expertise in one or more humanities, social sciences, or arts disciplines
- Strong interests in inter- and trans-disciplinary work
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Ability to work both independently and on teams
- Excellent organizational and process management skills
- High level of motivation, positive attitude and a strong desire to learn and collaborate

The Chicago Humanities Festival (CHF) is the largest and longest-running urban festival of arts and ideas in the United States. Now in its 27th year, CHF produces around 170 events each year. Anchored in its signature fall festival, which in 2016 sold more than 40,000 tickets, CHF is now also a year-round programmer.

Our stages have welcomed 10 Nobel laureates, more than 70 Pulitzer Prize winners, and over 50 MacArthur “Genius” Fellows, as well as Grammy, Tony, and Oscar winners. Some notable presenters from our 27th annual Fall Festival, “Speed,” include Lin-Manuel Miranda, Thomas Friedman, Gloria Steinem, Isabel Wilkerson and Trevor Noah.
